### Changes to the Quality Management Plan

To provide homeowners more certainty in their home's development, we've made changes to our Quality Management Plan to help ensure our building safety values are in line with industry standards.

The City will now require all contractors – plumbing, gas and electrical – to request inspections at both rough-in and final stages of new construction, and the minimum value for building inspections has increased. These improvements provide homeowners with an extra layer of protection in the building process and allows the City to review construction quality and compliance.
